

Second Sunday of Advent

Almost nine hundred years ago, Saint Bernard of Clairvaux suggested in one of his Advent homilies that we should think of three Advents of Christ: the First, when Christ came in humility as Mary's Child, clothed in our human nature; the Second, when Christ will come in glory as Judge and Redeemer of the world. Then Saint Bernard speaks of a Middle Coming, an "in the meantime" Advent, when Christ comes to us in his Word, in the Eucharist, and in those who need our love and care, family and friends, neighbors and strangers. That's this year's Advent, the one we're celebrating now; and this Advent's question is: how attentive am I to Christ's coming into my life-story, right here, right now?

AN UNNOTICED ADVENT

Today Luke solemnly announces the names of the secular and sacred powers who thought they held the world's destiny in their hands. But they completely missed the decisive event that forever changed the world's religious and political history. When no one else was listening, God's Word came to a nobody, John the Baptist, and not in the temple sanctuary or palace throne room, but "out in the sticks," the Word that would one day cleanse the temple and topple thrones. The powerful names that Luke announces were not popular with ordinary people: times were tough, the economy was bad, people were having to make do with less; and those names reminded common folks that so much of life was beyond their control. Sound familiar? Yet just then, when many were far from hopeful, God acted decisively to save the people, and John the Baptist invited his listeners then, and us today, to join in the Good News of new life.

GOD'S RECONSTRUCTION PLAN

We heard Baruch, in the first reading, picturing our broken world reborn: the dispersed being carried home, tears wiped away, righteousness and justice, peace and worship. How we wish it could all be true! It will be true, Paul declares, optimistic that God, who has already begun such good work in us, will continue to complete it for the day of Christ's glorious return, increasing our love and sharpening our discernment of the values that endure. So we should begin this second week of Advent reinvigorated with hope in God's plan for the world's salvation. But John the Baptist reminds us that God's "reconstruction plan" for the world's transformation begins much closer to home: what twists and turns of my own life must be untangled, what lofty mountains of my own pride and self-centeredness brought low, which gorge-deep valleys of my own indifference and neglect filled in? Come, Lord Jesus, and make the whole creation new—but start right here, right now, with me!

Are you an active practicing Catholic adult who "missed" participating in the Sacrament of Confirmation? We invite you to enter the process of preparation at the parish.







Segundo Domingo de Adviento

Hace casi novecientos años, san Bernardo de Claraval sugirió en una de sus homilías de Adviento que deberíamos pensar en tres Advientos de Cristo: el primero cuando Cristo vino humildemente como el Niño de María, revestido de nuestra naturaleza humana; el segundo cuando Cristo venga en gloria como Juez y redentor del mundo. Luego, san Bernardo habla de una venida intermedia, un Adviento “mientras tanto”, cuando Cristo viene a nosotros en su Palabra, en la Eucaristía y en aquellos que necesitan nuestro amor y cuidado, familia y amigos, vecinos y extraños. Ese es el Adviento de este año, el que estamos celebrando ahora; y la pregunta de este Adviento es: ¿hasta qué punto estoy atento a la llegada de Cristo a la historia de mi vida, aquí y ahora?

UN ADVENIMIENTO INADVERTIDO

Hoy Lucas anuncia solemnemente los nombres de los poderes seculares y sagrados que creían tener en sus manos el destino del mundo. Pero se perdieron por completo el acontecimiento decisivo que cambió para siempre la historia religiosa y política del mundo. Cuando nadie escuchaba, la Palabra de Dios llegó a un don nadie, Juan el Bautista, y no en el santuario del templo o en la sala del trono de un palacio, sino “en la calle”, la Palabra que un día limpiaría el templo y derribaría tronos. Los poderosos nombres que anuncia Lucas no eran populares entre la gente común: los tiempos eran difíciles, la economía era mala, la gente tenía que arreglárselas con menos; y esos nombres recordaban a la gente común que gran parte de la vida estaba fuera de su control. ¿Les resulta familiar? Sin embargo, justo en ese momento, cuando muchos estaban lejos de la esperanza, Dios actuó con decisión para salvar al pueblo.

EL PLAN DE RECONSTRUCCIÓN DE DIOS

Escuchamos a Baruc, en la primera lectura, imaginando nuestro mundo roto renaciendo: los dispersos siendo llevados a casa, las lágrimas enjugadas, la rectitud y la justicia, la paz y la adoración. Cómo quisiéramos que todo esto fuera verdad. Pablo declara que será verdad, optimista de que Dios, que ya ha comenzado una obra tan buena en nosotros, seguirá completándola para el día del regreso glorioso de Cristo, aumentando nuestro amor y agudizando nuestro discernimiento de los valores que perduran. Así pues, deberíamos comenzar esta segunda semana de Adviento revigorizados con la esperanza en el plan de Dios para la salvación del mundo. Pero Juan el Bautista nos recuerda que el “plan de reconstrucción” de Dios para la transformación del mundo comienza mucho más cerca de casa: ¿qué giros de mi propia vida hay que desenredar, qué montañas elevadas de mi propio orgullo y egocentrismo hay que rebajar, qué valles profundos de mi propia indiferencia y negligencia hay que llenar? Ven, Señor Jesús, y haz que toda la creación sea nueva, pero empieza aquí y ahora conmigo.


