Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time October 3, 2021

Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.

— *Mark 10:14*

Our readings today point to God's deep commitment to human relationships. Our passage from Genesis begins with the declaration that God created human persons to be social beings, who can only thrive when they live in deep connection with each other and with God. The author of Hebrews teaches that the coming of Jesus as one of us shows God's radical commitment to human life. Jesus' teaching about divorce, described in today's Gospel, shows God's deep investment in marriage and, implicitly, all human relationships. When our personal relationships with others are distant or broken, God seeks to heal them. When social structures serve to maintain oppression, or to keep groups in ongoing conflict, God is working to overthrow them. Even when we give up on each other, God does not give up. God will work ceaselessly, in us and through us, within all the pain and joy of the human situation.

LIKE A CHILD

Today's passage from Mark's Gospel is in the context of Jesus' teaching about the kingdom, or reign, of God. A common understanding was that entering the kingdom was based on family origin, or achievement, or status in the community. Jesus pushes back on this, and presents a child as a model of receptivity and openness.

This is not to suggest that adults must somehow reject the wisdom gained through adult experience and return to childhood. Adult maturity also includes the difficult journey, usually later in life, of letting go of illusions that we have built up about our own virtue, skills, and autonomy. Jesus' teaching pushes back against our culture, which honors energy and vigor, expertise and achievement. These valuable gifts can fail us if we cannot accept our dependence on God who provides and cultivates these gifts. We can accept God's graciousness in our life when we open our hearts as a child does.

PROUD TO BE HUMAN

This is the first of seven consecutive Sundays that we will share passages from the Letter to the Hebrews. The letter is an extended sermon by an unknown author directed to a Christian community where likely many were converts from Judaism. The author attempts to link Jesus to the story of the people of Israel, building toward an image of Christ as God's perfect high priest. Christ the High Priest is described as the central link between humanity and God.

When we reflect upon the life and death of Jesus, we can more deeply accept that through Jesus, God knows what we humans experience. Jesus the High Priest embraces his humanity. In today's passage, the author claims that Jesus is proud to be human, proud to be our brother in the family of God. The letter to the Hebrews is not only a celebration of Christ, it is an affirmation of the dignity of our own human life.



Virtus Training at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church


The Diocese of Richmond requires that all those who minister with children, youth or vulnerable adults complete the Virtus Safe Environment Training.

Young Adult Discipleship:



VIGÉSIMO SÉPTIMO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

3 DE OCTUBRE DE 2021

Nuestras lecturas de hoy señalan el profundo compromiso de Dios con las relaciones humanas. El pasaje del Génesis inicia con el anuncio de que Dios creó a las personas humanas para que fueran seres sociales, que únicamente pueden prosperar cuando viven en una profunda conexión con los demás y con Dios. El autor de la carta a los hebreos enseña que la venida de Jesús como uno de nosotros muestra el compromiso radical de Dios con la vida humana. La enseñanza de Jesús acerca del divorcio, descrita en el Evangelio de hoy, muestra la profunda investidura de Dios en el matrimonio, e implícitamente, en todas las relaciones humanas. Cuando nuestras relaciones personales con los demás están distanciadas o rotas, Dios trata de sanarlas. Cuando las estructuras sociales sirven para mantener la opresión, o para mantener a los grupos en un conflicto continuo, Dios trabaja para acabarlas. Incluso cuando nos damos por vencidos, Dios no se da por vencido. Dios trabajará constantemente y a través de nosotros, dentro de todo el dolor y la alegría de la circunstancia humana.

COMO UN NIÑO

El pasaje de hoy del Evangelio de Marcos está en el contexto de la enseñanza de Jesús acerca del reino, o el reinado, de Dios. Una idea común era que la entrada en el reino se basaba en el origen familiar, en los logros o en el lugar que se tenía en la comunidad. Jesús se opone a eso y presenta a un niño como modelo de receptividad y apertura.

Esto no quiere decir que los adultos deban rechazar de algún modo la sabiduría adquirida a través de la experiencia adulta y volver a la infancia. La madurez adulta también incluye el viaje difícil, generalmente más tarde en la vida, de dejar ir las ilusiones que hemos construido sobre nuestra propia virtud, habilidades y autonomía. Las enseñanzas de Jesús se oponen a nuestra cultura, que honra la energía y el vigor, la experiencia y los logros. Estos valiosos dones pueden fallar si no aceptamos nuestra dependencia en Dios, que proporciona y cultiva estos dones. Podemos aceptar la gracia de Dios en nuestra vida cuando abrimos nuestro corazón como lo hace un niño.

ORGULLOSO DE SER HUMANO

Hoy es el primero de siete domingos consecutivos en los que se leerá la carta a los hebreos. La carta es un sermón extenso de un autor desconocido dirigido a la comunidad cristiana en la que probablemente muchos de origen judío empezaron a seguir las enseñanzas de Jesús. El autor intenta vincular a Jesús con la historia del pueblo de Israel, construyendo una imagen en Cristo como el sumo sacerdote perfecto de Dios. Cristo, el Sumo Sacerdote, es descrito como el vínculo central entre la humanidad y Dios.

Cuando reflexionamos sobre la vida y la muerte de Jesús, podemos aceptar más profundamente que, a través de Jesús, Dios conoce lo que experimentamos los humanos. Jesús, el Sumo Sacerdote, abraza su humanidad. En el pasaje de hoy, el autor afirma que Jesús está orgulloso de ser humano, orgulloso de ser nuestro hermano en la familia de Dios. La carta a los hebreos no es sólo una celebración de Cristo, sino una afirmación de la dignidad de nuestra propia vida humana.


