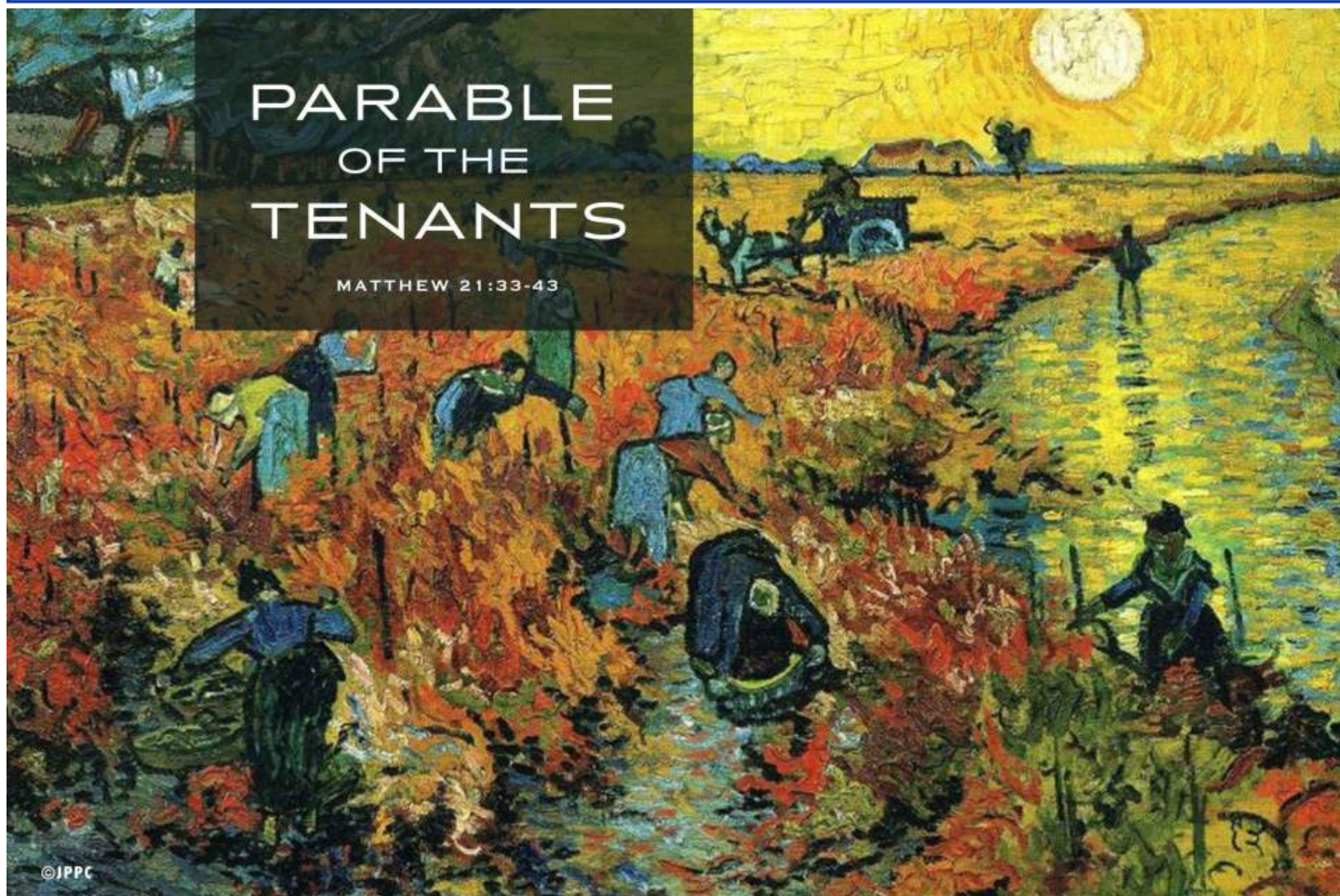

Dear Parishioners:

I can't tell you how excited I am to be able to announce that we will soon begin the construction phase of the Splendor of Carmel campaign. It will truly be a gift of eternal beauty for our beautiful parish.

The last Mass in "the old Church" will be on Sunday, 8 October. Then the next weekend, we will begin celebrating Holy Mass, Confessions, and Adoration in Saint Michael Hall. The construction is likely to conclude sometime in the middle of next summer – though we can always pray for miracles! During the renovation, the parish Church will be closed to the public for all liturgies, and all other activities. A couple of details:

- Saint Michael Hall will continue to be used for the many ministries of the parish during the week and weekend. Please be flexible about seating, and understand that the building will be getting a lot of use – with far more people using the building each week.
- As you enter Saint Michael Hall, please take a hymnal from the racks, and return it to the rack at the end of Mass. Please extend courtesy to others by sliding in to the middle of each row so that we can maximize seating.
- The Blessed Sacrament Chapel will be moved to Saint Michael Hall, in a dedicated room used only for prayer. It will be open each day for private prayer and will not be used for anything else.
- Confessions will take place in a dedicated room as well in Saint Michael Hall. During the renovation, confession will be behind the screen only.
- On Sundays and Holy Days, please leave the Saint Michael Hall lot for parishioners who are elderly, handicapped, or have mobility issues. Please park in the main lot and walk over to Saint Michael Hall.
- Please do not attempt to enter the Church during the renovation. For safety reasons and to be sure not to interrupt the progress, it is important that we not enter the Church building.

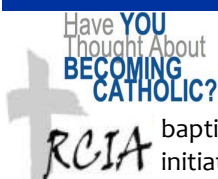
There will be no daily Mass or Confessions for the week of October 9th, which is our annual Priests' Convocation, and the week we will move everything into Saint Michael Hall. During the renovation, I'd ask you to please be generous and flexible. It will be a long time and the adjustment to walking over to Saint Michael Hall and coordinating the liturgy and the Masses will become tiresome. Keep a positive spirit, be patient (I'm working on that one too) and let's let the Holy Spirit direct us even more deeply into prayer.

This is a very exciting time for our parish – and I'm so grateful to all of our parishioners who have given so generously to help see the Splendor of Carmel become a reality. We will keep updates on the construction coming, and pictures on our Facebook page. Buckle up, Mount Carmel, this is going to be a wild ride. I'm so honored to be with you as your pastor.

Initiation Programs and Adult Formation



The RCIA process is one of conversion and spiritual formation for individuals interested in living the Christian life in the Catholic tradition. It is a time of prayer, reflection, study, faith sharing, discernment and participation in the life of the parish. Awakening Faith – Reconnecting with Your Catholic Faith is a small group process that helps inactive Catholics return to the Church. The group meets once a week for six weeks of conversation and socializing. The conversations are based on short, easy to read essays about spirituality, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, God's mercy, the Mass, and the Church.

The meetings foster reflection, prayer, and honest sharing in a setting of hospitality and acceptance. A small community is formed and over the six weeks becomes a bridge to the larger Church community. We can assist your return to the active practice of your faith and welcome you back to the Lord's Table.

ENCOUNTERING CHRIST IN THE HOMELESS — PORT

Now that we have been nourished at this altar by the Bread of Life, we are sent to feed and care for our neighbor, respecting the rights that flow from his dignity as having been made in God's image. Everyone should look upon his neighbor as 'another self,' above all bearing in mind the means necessary for him to live his life with dignity. This duty to actively serve our neighbors becomes even more urgent when it involves the disadvantaged. CCC ¶¶ 1930-32.

One way to serve our neighbor is to heed the Lord's command to shelter the afflicted and the homeless, i.e. PORT. OLMC is a partner church responsible for serving the homeless on seven nights: November 2/3; November 30/ December 1; December 28/29; January 25/26 February 15/16; February 22/23 and March 7/8.

The sign up sheets will be available at the weekend Masses for October 14/15 and 21/22. You may wish to assist with checking in the guests, distributing clothes or checking the guests out in the morning. If so, please sign up. What we most need at this moment as leads for each of the nights. Look at the descriptions below and please consider taking one of the Lead Positions for a night.

The Dinner Lead determines the menu and gathers volunteers who will cook and/or serve and/or clean up. This is a perfect opportunity for a group to serve together — a guild, a bible study, a choir, TMIY, CNN students, Young Adults, Youth Apostles, just to name a few of the many groups in our parish. Or, an individual might feel called to be a Dinner Lead and will build their own group.

The Breakfast/Lunch Bag Lead determines the contents of the breakfast/lunch bags that will be given to the guests upon their departure, gathers a team to assemble the bags and then delivers them to the host church the afternoon of OLMC's day. The items will be provided by OLMC.
