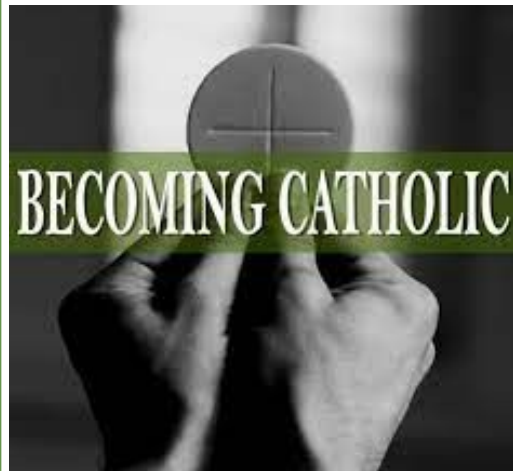

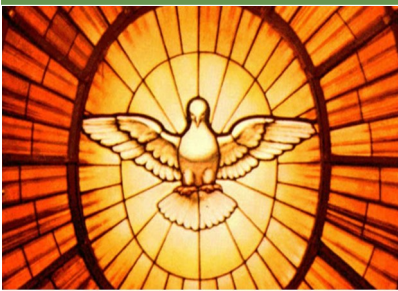


Are you or anyone you know interested in exploring the Catholic Church as your church home?

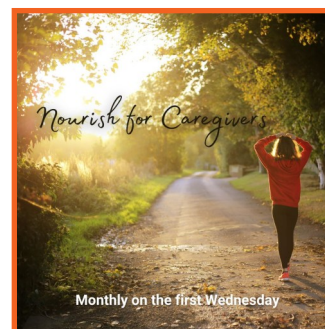
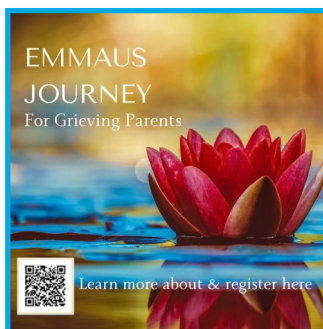
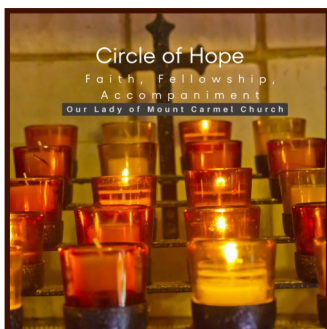

Pastoral Care



Circle of Hope is a Catholic faith-based, spiritually uplifting group of men and women who are going through or have gone through a health issue, cancer diagnosis, or suffer chronic illness. We gather on the **first Saturday of every month** for fellowship, prayer and support. **Newcomers are always welcome.**

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion for the Sick and Homebound bring the grace and healing power of the Holy Eucharist to parishioners who are sick or homebound and not able to attend Mass either regularly or temporarily.

Emmaus Journey for Grieving Parents is a spiritual retreat for parents whose child(ren) of any age have died by any cause, no matter how long ago. The Emmaus Journey is a daylong retreat that offers a safe place where you can find peace, comfort and hope. Visit our website for upcoming dates and registration.

Funeral Ministries support families through our hospitality and usher teams. The hospitality ministry provides food and refreshments for families and friends following the funeral liturgy of a loved one. Ushers serve at the funeral liturgies. These ministries take little time but provide much consolation to families.

Nourish for Caregivers connects family caregivers with others with similar circumstances, and provides practical and emotional supports with a Christ-centered view. We gather monthly on Wednesday evenings. All are welcome.

OLMC Van Drivers ensure that lack of transportation is never a barrier to attend Holy Mass. Our volunteer drivers extend the warmth of our faith and foster connection within our parish community. Our team of dedicated volunteer drivers transport folks to and from the 10:00am Mass on Sundays.

Seasons of Hope offers a safe and compassionate environment for adults whose loved one has died. Seasons of Hope, rooted in Catholic tradition, conveys God's consolation through scripture, prayer, reflection and sharing our faith. This grief support small group is offered seasonally, visit our website for upcoming dates and registration.

SPRED (Special Religious Development) prepares adults with intellectual disabilities to fully belong in the liturgical life of the parish. Adults with and without disabilities come together to share a one-on-one relationship and to form a small faith group. SPRED fosters and nourishes spiritual and personal growth.

Reaching Out into community

Our Lady of Mount Carmel's Office of Social Ministries directly responds to the call of Jesus to feed the hungry, give shelter to the homeless, care for the orphan and widow in their distress, and to assist the poor and vulnerable right here in our own Newport News community.

Pantry Sorters

This ministry is a good fit for families looking to be involved in ministry together.

The Pantry Sorter ministry involves:

- Volunteering once a week on an 8 week rotation
- Approximately 208 hours of service per year
- Moving food donations from the Commons to the Food Pantry
- Sorting and organizing the food onto the pantry shelves

Outreach Office

This ministry is a good fit for those with daytime availability. Ministry needs are Monday, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 12-2pm and Tuesday and Friday from 9 to 11am, you can help on the day(s) that works best for you. Some volunteers work once a week, some once a month, and many work somewhere in between the two.

Parishioners can volunteer to help in many ways:

- Answering Phones
- Interviewing Clients/Preparing Food Bags
- Calling Clients Back

You can help as little or as much as you want.

Pregnancy Outreach

OLMC is pro-life. In addition to pro-life advocacy and preaching, we actively serve women, men, and families facing unplanned pregnancy in order to help them make the decision for life. This ministry is best staffed with women. We have opportunities for daytime or evening hours. This is a ministry of celebrating life.

Parishioners can volunteer to help in many ways:

- Assist in sorting and putting away baby clothes when seasons
- Assist during appointments
- Help with answering the 24 hour pregnancy HelpLine

Opportunities with One-Time Events

These are ways you can serve without the commitment of a long term project – consider it a one and done. As these events come up specific need and contact information will be available in the bulletin. Serving in this way is equally as important as a long term commitment.

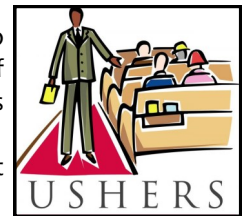
This ministry is open to any practicing Catholic, in good standing with the Church, who has received the sacrament of Confirmation. Training is offered as needed.


