

Awakening Faith - Reconnecting with Your Catholic Faith is a small group process that helps inactive AWAKENING Catholics return to the Church. The group meets once a week for six weeks of conversation and socializing. The conversations are based on short, easy to read essays about spirituality, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, God's mercy, the Mass, and the Church.



The meetings foster reflection, prayer, and honest sharing in a setting of hospitality and acceptance. A small community is formed and over the six weeks becomes a bridge to the larger Church community. #### **Pastoral Care**

Do you have a loved one who is no longer physically able to attend Holy Mass?

Our pastoral care ministers are ready to serve by administering Holy Communion and sharing sacred scripture with the sick or homebound of our parish. The faithful who are homebound are often separated from their place in the Eucharistic community. We serve Catholics who are hospitalized, receiving rehabilitation, homebound or living in assisted living communities.

Contact the parish office to inquire about pastoral care for yourself or a loved one.

#### When you need a break. The Respite Ministry is there to help.

Your role as a family caregiver is an important one. The Respite Ministry offers compassionate care provided by trained parishioners who provide safety, supervision, and companioning to the homebound loved one. If you are a full-time caretaker of a home-bound loved one, call the parish office to inquire about Respite Care.

#### How can respite care help the family caregiver? Take regular breaks for better health.

Family caregivers often don't have enough time to take care of their own health. If this sounds like you, a couple of hours of respite care can free up time for you to visit your doctor, meet a friend for coffee or take a walk. These small steps can lower your stress level.

## Social Ministry

## Extraordinary Generosity in Ordinary Time A Peek into the Pantry

Our wonderful ministry of feeding the hungry — one of the great corporal works of mercy — requires many hands. First and foremost are your hands when you bring food for the pantry and teach your children to do the same. Yours also when you give to the Poor Fund.

Next, that food must get from the church commons into bags handed to our neighbors. Enter the Pantry Sorters. Each weekend, one of five families on a rotating basis gather the food, sort it and shelve it in the pantry. Sometimes, they find an interesting offering — such as a can of green jackfruit or a jar of marinated artichoke hearts. While these delicacies may delight the palate of some, they are not part of our regular stock. Nothing is wasted though.

The interesting offerings, along with food in damaged packaging and food past its expiration date, are put on a shelf in Outreach's waiting room, with an appropriate sign. Our clients are encouraged to take whatever they might want. [The green jackfruit waited 3 months for a home.]

The Pantry Baggers have the privilege of filling bags for our clients. Taking into account the number and age of adults and children, and any health concerns, they fill the bags with food, as well as information regarding other available resources. We serve our neighbors who have made appointments, five days a week for two hours each day. After the client has had a brief intake interview by an Outreach volunteer, the Pantry Bagger assists them taking the food to their transportation.




## Liturgy




The lector ministry is open to all practicing Catholics sixteen and older who have received the sacrament of confirmation.
